Academic Affairs leaders who have spearheaded significant transformations within their institutions will participate in a panel discussing their colleges' shift to shortened academic terms. These leaders will share their experiences in transitioning their respective colleges from traditional-length semesters to shortened terms. The focus of the panel discussion will revolve around the

motivations behind their institutions' decisions to adopt this new approach and the comprehensive strategies they employed to implement these changes. The panel will delve into the critical factors that necessitated this shift, exploring the benefits of shortened terms, such as increased flexibility for students, improved retention rates, and enhanced alignment with workforce demands. Dr. Piazza, Dr. Clunis, and Dr. Rogalski will provide an overview of the planning and execution processes that facilitated this transformation, highlighting the collaborative efforts between college administration and faculty. Attendees will gain valuable insights into the challenges encountered during the implementation phase, with the panelists discussing key considerations and potential pitfalls to watch out for. The leaders will share their firsthand experiences on how they navigated obstacles, managed resistance, and ensured smooth transitions for students and staff alike.

Leading Leaders: Effective Leadership in the Al Era

Future community college leaders will face significant challenges, including declining enrollment and revenue, the "workforce sansdemic," rising costs, diminishing confidence in the value of college credentials, increased competition from alternative educational options, and, most critically, the transformative implications of artificial intelligence (AI). These factors will profoundly reshape how colleges operate and serve their communities. Institutions that are poised for success will anticipate challenges and strategically harness the opportunities that disruption can bring. Leadership under such conditions will require a strong focus on cultivating an inclusive leadership culture that fosters commitment, resilience, strategic foresight, and innovation.

In our keynote address, Dr. James Ball, will explore how community colleges can remain essential in the AI era. Dr. Ball will share reflections and response to challenges during his career and discuss strategies for rising stars to advance careers while fostering a leadership culture that identifies, nurtures, and empowers leadership within your institution. He will provide insights on claiming needed resources from within, assuring commitment through building a strong sense of

belonging, using teams to drive strategic innovation, positioning your college as an indispensable resource for the communities it serves.
